Personal Statement

Megan qualified as a speech and language therapist in South Africa in 2015 and commenced her career working in a neurorehabilitation centre and private practice supporting adults following neurological events such as head injury and stroke. Megan relocated to London in 2018, joining a neuro community team where she collaborated with the multidisciplinary team to support a range of clients diagnosed with progressive disorders, such as motor neurone disease, Parkinson's disease and complex co-morbidities, including autistic spectrum disorders, to reach their goals.

Megan's keen interest in community work, and commitment to making a tangible difference, propelled her into leadership positions. She has coordinated acute and critical care teams championing the needs of clients from hospital care to rehabilitation centres and home. Megan has led a community multidisciplinary team, assessing clients with complex, life changing and often deteriorating conditions, working closely with clients and family members, recruiting and supervising rehabilitation support workers and care agency staff, and undertaking risk assessments. Megan is well versed in working with clients who are deemed to lack capacity under the Mental Health Act, and in arranging and contributing to Best Interest Decisions.

Megan empowers and motivates clients through paying attention to their individual priorities and wishes, collaborative goal-setting and measuring outcomes and progress. Her clinical background provides a unique understanding of communication, enabling her to provide tailored support to clients with communication challenges and their families, enhancing their comprehension and expression of personal desires and needs.

Megan also has extensive experience chairing NHS Trust diversity networks particularly focusing on LGBTQ+ issues, showcasing her dedication to fostering inclusivity.

Demonstrating a commitment to lifelong learning, Megan enhances her professional skills through networking with colleagues and undertaking relevant training courses, webinars and conferences in her role as a case manager.
