Annick is a registered health professional with an extensive background in neurorehabilitation. She has worked clinically in acute and regional rehabilitation NHS services, statutory community services and in the private sector as a highly specialist neuro physiotherapist for over 20 years, working primarily with adults with neurological diagnoses.

In addition, from 2018 to 2019, Annick worked in stroke research at The National Hospital for Neurology and Neurosurgery on a range of hyper-acute and acute randomised controlled trials. This included the set-up and running, and recruitment and follow up of patients in these trials, which developed her breadth of knowledge and skills in working with large and diverse research teams in the UK and internationally.

Annick has worked as a catastrophic injury case manager since 2020 supporting clients following traumatic brain injury, amputation and complex orthopaedic injuries. She is a strong team player who coordinates and manages rehabilitation for her clients with the aim of promoting recovery, function and independence. Annick works closely with clients and their families, the medical and therapy teams, and legal and insurance teams, to ensure that the client achieves optimal outcomes. Annick has experience of recruiting to and managing domiciliary 24-hour care packages, and has excellent communication, organisational and management skills. She manages, trains and mentors support workers ensuring high quality professional and sector standards are upheld.
